GATHERING IN CHURCH FOR MASS

As the COVID restrictions begin to ease we are now able to gather again in church for Mass.

As before, there are certain conditions in place:

- MAXIMUM of 50 people
- Social distancing
- Follow the direction of the Stewards
- Sanitising hands on entry and exit
- Wearing mask covering nose & mouth while inside
- Church doors will also need to be left open to provide the necessary ventilation

Up to 50 people can now attend funerals and wedding services in church. However, the government are advising that other religious ceremonies, especially those that could involve gatherings before/afterwards like Baptisms, Communion and Confirmations, do not take place at this time.

BUILDING HOPE TOGETHER DUBLIN DIOCESAN TASK FORCE UPDATE

You may have seen from a previous newsletter that Archbishop Farrell has set up a Task Force to look at the needs of the Diocese and to work to support Parishes, Diocesan Agencies and Chaplaincies, to undertake a radical renewal. This is to help us to look to the future with hope and creativity. The members of the Task Force come from a variety of backgrounds and parts of the Diocese with a balance between lay & clerical, and male & female.

The work of the Task Force has four stages:

- **To gather the thoughts & ideas of people**
- **To assess the themes and comments that come through**
- **To report to the Archbishop**
- **To offer a pastoral approach which is inclusive and appropriate to our time.**

Soon you will be invited to take part in stage one by responding to a general consultation. This could be done as an individual or you could have a conversation with a mix of generations in your family and get one of you to fill in the consultation form. You might gather as a group of friends, or those involved in a particular ministry, to have a conversation about what is being asked and then one of the group can fill in the form. You could invite friends and neighbours to engage with the consultation, reaching out to those who may not hear about it through the Church. All responses to the consultation are welcome and anonymous.

As well as completing the consultation form, please pray for the work as it progresses; that the Holy Spirit will guide the Task Force in supporting Parishes and others as we look to the future with creativity and hope.
